CANADIAN OBSERVATORY HELD DIALOGUE MEETING IN OTTAWA


The Canadian observatory held a successful dialogue meeting in Ottawa on May 27, 2010. The meeting was hosted by Dr. Holly Johnson, University of Ottawa. Workshop participants included co-investigators of the Canadian observatory and federal/provincial/territorial counterparts. Everyone was enthusiastic about possibilities to strengthen relationships and in moving forward with data collection and data sharing between governments and the Canadian observatory. Participants recommend a multi-pronged strategy incorporating data collection, building on clearly articulated research objectives; data sharing with the appropriate mechanism to assure confidentiality and security of information if disclosed; strengthened partnerships based on the needs of the partners and which addresses the variety of jurisdictional issues of researchers; and a strengthened dialogue process to respond to research and jurisdictional issues. The meeting was possible with funding from Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council.

NEW BOOK

Voices of Grief, Healing and Action from the Missing Indigenous Women Conference, 2008.

Since 1980, more than 520 Aboriginal women have been reported missing or murdered in Canada. From 1993-2003, 370 women were murdered in Ciudad Juarez and Chihuahua, Mexico. Since 2001, more than 2,000 Guatemalan women and girls have been brutally murdered. Responding to the profound tragedy inherent in these statistics, more than 300 women and men gathered in August 2008 at a conference entitled Missing Women: Decolonization, Third Wave Feminisms, and Indegenous People of Canada and Mexico. Torn from Our Midst includes images and voices from the conference, together with additional reflections, both academic personal, on the effects of violence and the possibilities for healing.
